## The bible




#### Following God's rules

- Be happy with what you have.






## Churches and communion

#### The church

The special place where Christians go to worship is called a church. Churches are buildings that hold services for Christians including Sunday services, weddings and baptisms. Christians all over the world worship in churches together; singing songs, reading and listening to the bible, talks, praying and sharing communion.



### Communion

## Christian symbols

The **candle flame** is another symbol as Jesus is known as the light of the world to Christians. It is seen as a symbol of hope in dark times.



The dove in Christianity is known as the dove of peace.. In the bible, doves are first mentioned at the end of the story of Noah's Ark, where they find an olive branch and bring it to Noah.



# Christian Beliefs

Christians believe that God created the world.

God said "Let there be light!" and there was light. God separated light and dark and called the light "day" and the darkness "night". On the second day God made the earth and sky.
