When Was the First Car Invented?

Benz builds the first 'Benz Patent Motorwagon' in Germany.

Karl Benz invented the car using a petrol engine, which is the model still used now. Before he built this car, there were vehicles that used steam to move!

A History of Cars

Before Karl Benz invented the first car using a petrol engine, Nicolas-Joseph Cugnot had created a steam driven carriage in 1770, in France.

Cugnot's Steam Carriage (1770)

It had two wheels at the back and one at the front. The steam created from the boiler at the front made the wheels turn. Cugnot's steam carriage turned out to be very impractical. The boiler caused it to be too heavy at the front. Also the fire needed to be relit every 15 minutes to keep producing enough steam!

Benz Patent Motorwagon (1885)

From 1885 till 1893, 25 motorwagons were built. In 1899, 572 were built in that year alone.

Fact: The motorwagon reached a top speed of 11mph. This is slightly slower than the average speed of a running person!

Electric cars were popular in the late 19th and early 20th century.

By 1914 they had lost their popularity to the petrol car, which was easier and cheaper to run at the time.

The Toyota Corolla is currently the best selling car in the world. They are mainly built in Japan.

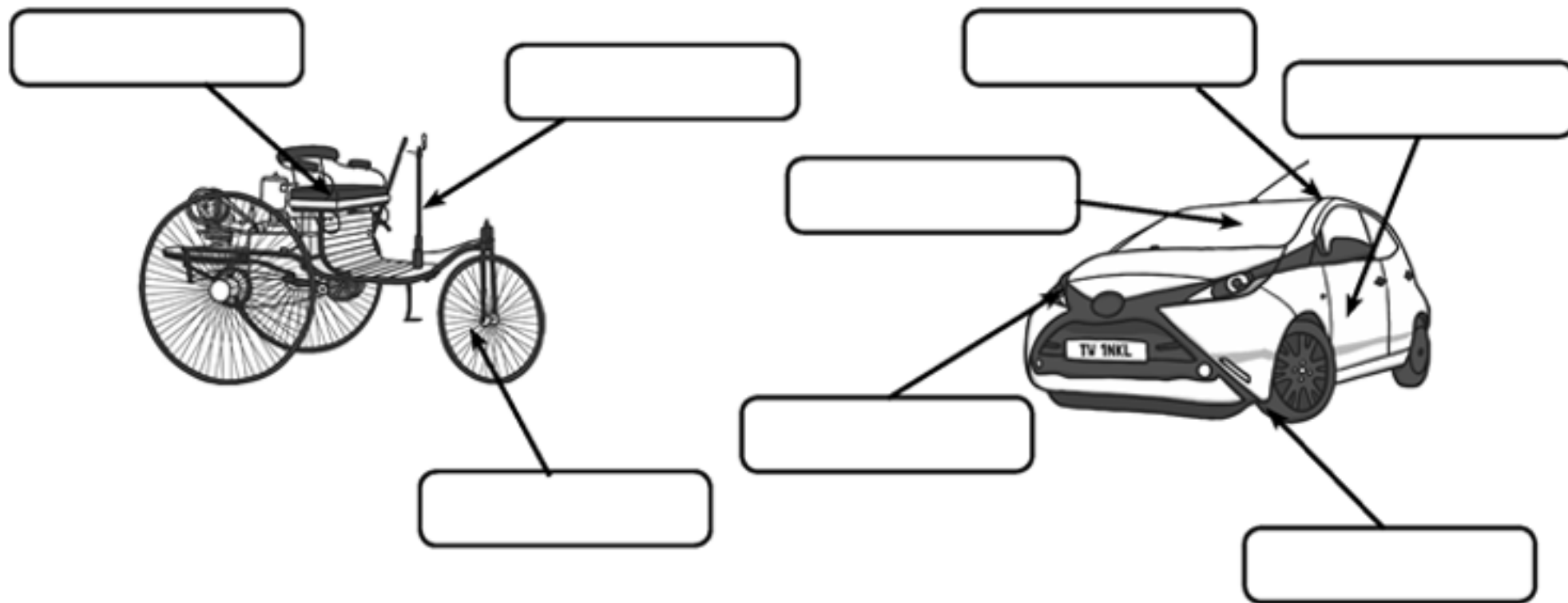
