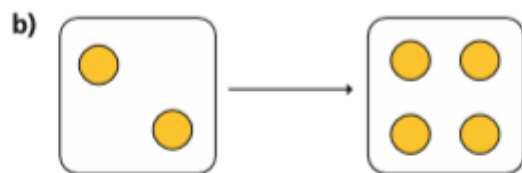

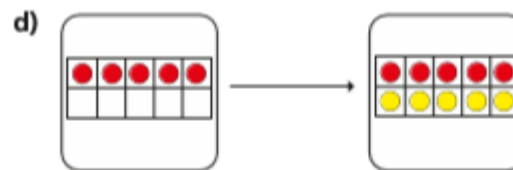

Religious Education



Recap
Last time when we looked at Christian beliefs, there were some important images and symbols that Christians use in their daily lives to help them feel closer to God. Some of these are;

- The cross** - This reminds people that Jesus died on a cross
- Candle** - They are lit to represent God's love.
- The dove** - in Christianity is known as the dove of peace
- The fish** - This symbol secretly showed that a person believed in and followed Jesus. Today, you might still see it!

Key areas inside the church and artifacts

- The altar**
The altar is a raised area in a house of worship where people can honour God with offerings. It is prominent in the Bible as "God's table," a sacred place for sacrifices and gifts offered up to God.
- A chalice of wine and plate of bread for communion.**
The bread and the wine are very important symbols for Christians as they are seen as reminders of how Jesus died on the cross to show how much God loves the world.
- A baptism font.**
Christians use this special font to welcome a person into the family God. The water used is blessed and then poured over the person's head. This is to show new life.
- The Bible**
The Bible is used by Christians to give them guidance about how they can live their lives in the way God would want them to.
- The cross**
The cross is about the message of love. Christians believe that Jesus died on the cross to help people remember that they are forgiven.

Why are these artifacts important?
Inside the church, there are some special areas and artifacts that are used to help Christians. Below are some examples of what these might look like.

A lectern.
This is used when reading from the bible and for special talks (sermons). The lectern is shaped as an eagle with the wings pointed towards heaven.

The cross
The cross is about the message of love. Christians believe that Jesus died on the cross to help people remember that they are forgiven.
