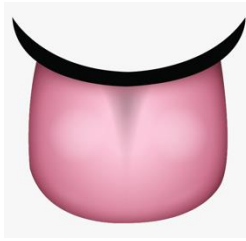
Colour by numbers – solve the calculations in the picture to work out what colour they should be:

Before I meet my fate!

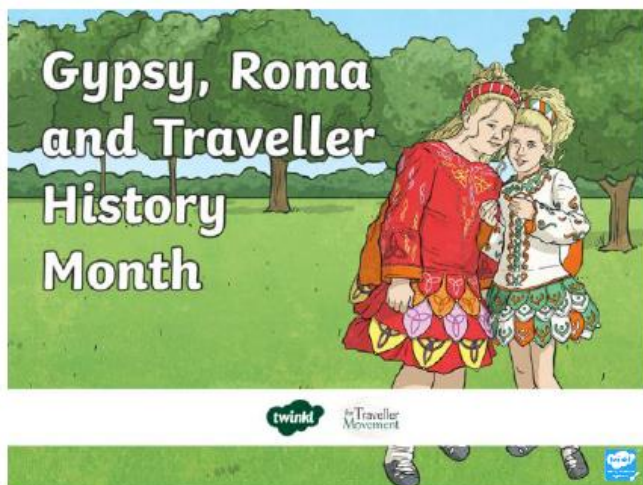

### Aim

- To begin to understand traditional ways of life for Gypsies, Roma and Travellers.
- To know the purpose of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month.

### What Is GRTHM?

GRTHM stands for Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month. Every year, during the month of June, people are encouraged to join together and celebrate the diversity and richness that Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities bring to the UK.



New Travellers include Showpeople, Narrowboat and Dargee families.

### A Celebration

Gypsies, Roma and Travellers have made huge contributions through dance, particularly Flamenco, music, storytelling, poetry, and art and design.




### Famous Gypsies and Travellers

Django Reinhardt, a Belgian Sinti Gypsy, was one of the greatest jazz musicians in the world.

The Romany Diamonds are a popular Polish Roma group.

Le Taraf Häïdouks, Fanfare Ciocărlia and the Hungarian Gypsy Orchestra are amongst the most popular orchestral performers in the world.

In the UK, Tommy Pearce and Jamal Jimenez are part of the developing Gypsy Rap movement.



### The Romani Flag


The official Romani flag is a symbol for all people who identify as Roma. It is not the flag of a country, but a people.

The flag is blue and green with a red wheel in the centre.

Blue symbolises the sky and the heavens. It stands for external spiritual values.

The green is for the land, nature and environment. It symbolises the earth and growth.

The red wheel symbolises movement and progress.





## Life on the Road

Life on the road has never been easy for people who live a nomadic life.

Laws have been passed to prevent people stopping their caravans in certain places, like the roadsides and on wasteland.



## Truth and Myth

Gypsies and Travellers have been part of British society for over 500 years.

There are between 250 000 and 300 000 Gypsies, Roma and Travellers in the UK.

Not all people from the Gypsy and Traveller community live in caravans. Many live in permanent housing or on private campsites with long-stay permission.

Traditional skills are passed down through generations. As in other communities, languages and beliefs are also handed down through families.



## More Understanding

Due to a lack of understanding about their way of life, Gypsies, Roma and Travellers have often suffered prejudice and persecution.

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month aims to change that through raising awareness and celebrating the unique cultures of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities.
