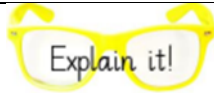

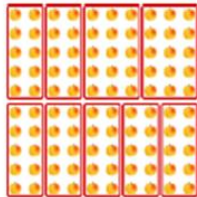

The first boats

- The oldest boat is a canoe. This boat dates back to 8000BC!



- The Ancient Egyptians travelled using boat along the River Nile. The earliest boats were made from bundles of papyrus reeds and were moved using oars. By 3000BC the Egyptians were using boats made of wood with sails to move them around.

Viking Longboats

- Around 1000AD, the Vikings started to build longboats.
- These were larger ships that had sails and up to sixty men whose job it was to row the ship.
- The boats were large but were narrow and long, allowed them to travel along rivers as well as the open sea.



Wooden ships



- Around 1450 wooden ships with three or four masts were in use by several different countries.
- These masted sailing ships were used as trade vessels, by explorers, to transport cargo, and as battleships.

Brunel's Great Steamships

Isombar Kingdom Brunel built three steamships. Steamships used wind and steam power to move. Each marked a technological leap forward.

By the 1980s container ships were used to transport cargo.



In the 1990s passenger cruise ships took people on holidays.



In 1838 **The Great Western** was built. This was Brunel's first steamship. It was built from wood.



In 1843 **The Great Britain** was built. This ship was built with an iron hull and was pushed through the water with a propeller. It sailed to America in 14 days. The fastest at the time!



The Great Eastern started being built in 1854. This was the largest steamship in the world and could carry nearly 4000 passengers!
