
## Art





Of course, over time, graffiti has <u>evolved</u> and it really made an impact on society and culture in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Even with modern technology enhancements, people are still compelled to leave their mark anywhere they can.



Constructed in 1961, the Berlin Wall is a perfect example of modern graffiti. Built as a way to divide West Berlin from the Communist East Berlin, the wall divided the city until 1989 when political liberations would sweep across Germany, eventually coming down in a historical way.

Although people were prohibited from approaching the wall on the east side, those on the west were free to approach the wall and they not only came up to <u>it</u>, <u>but</u> adorned it with lots of street art and graffiti. To this day, it's alive with colorful illustrations of the sentiments of **peace and love**.







New York is considered the <u>birth place</u> for modern graffiti and the city has birthed several famous graffiti artists over the years. But the height of this movement was in the 1980s, with the rise of notable figures like **Jean-Michel Basquiat**, **Keith Haring and Futura 2000**.

All three have very different styles and expressions, but emerged from the same environment and continue to inspire other creativity across the world.









By the 1990s, graffiti was everywhere and become its own art form. Many of the originators were growing up and expanding their talents, while a new crop of kids started to work on their writings.

Custom-made spray paint came to market and this allowed street artists to do more intricate paintings, thus increasing the quality of these works of art.


It was during this time that new techniques came about, with artists now using stickers and stencils to apply their art, which allowed them to create elaborate drawings that could easily be prepared in advance and then applied quickly, which was <a href="https://linear.com/ultra/mportant">ultra important</a> to avoid getting caught by officials.



**Banksy** is a <u>British</u> street and graffiti <u>artist</u>. He likes to remain <u>anonymous</u> and not let people know his true identity. He often draws in high visibility public places such as on <u>buildings</u> or <u>train stations</u>. His paintings are often about <u>politics</u>, <u>war</u> and other important topics.

His <u>satirical</u> <u>street art</u> and mind-hurting pictures combine dark <u>humour</u> with <u>graffiti</u>. The graffiti is done with a <u>stencilling</u> technique. Such works have been done on streets, walls, and bridges of cities throughout the world.

Banksy's work started in the <u>Bristol</u> underground scene, which had <u>collaborations</u> between artists and musicians. According to graphic designer Tristan Manco, Banksy "was born in 1974 and raised in Bristol, England. The son of a photocopier technician, he trained as a butcher but became involved in graffiti during the great Bristol aerosol boom of the late 1980s".






