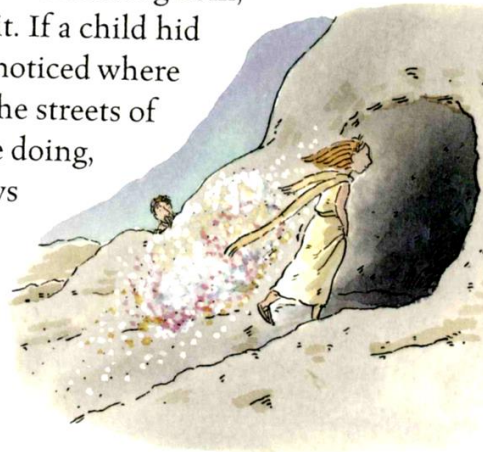

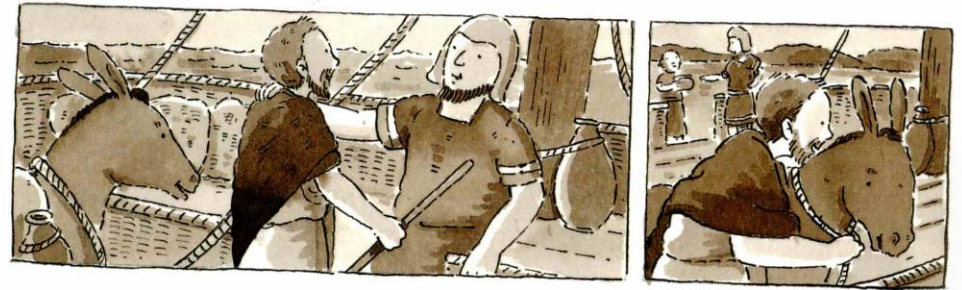

A boat had come into Aegina's harbour at last, and it was one Atticus knew.


