Then, old Mrs Rabbit took a basket and her umbrella, and went through the wood to the baker's. She bought a loaf of brown bread and five currant buns.



And then, feeling rather sick, he went to look for some parsley.


But round the end of a cucumber frame, whom should he meet, but Mr McGregor!






