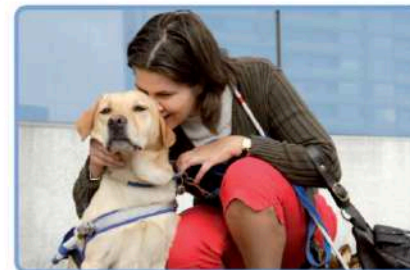

## Vocabulary Check



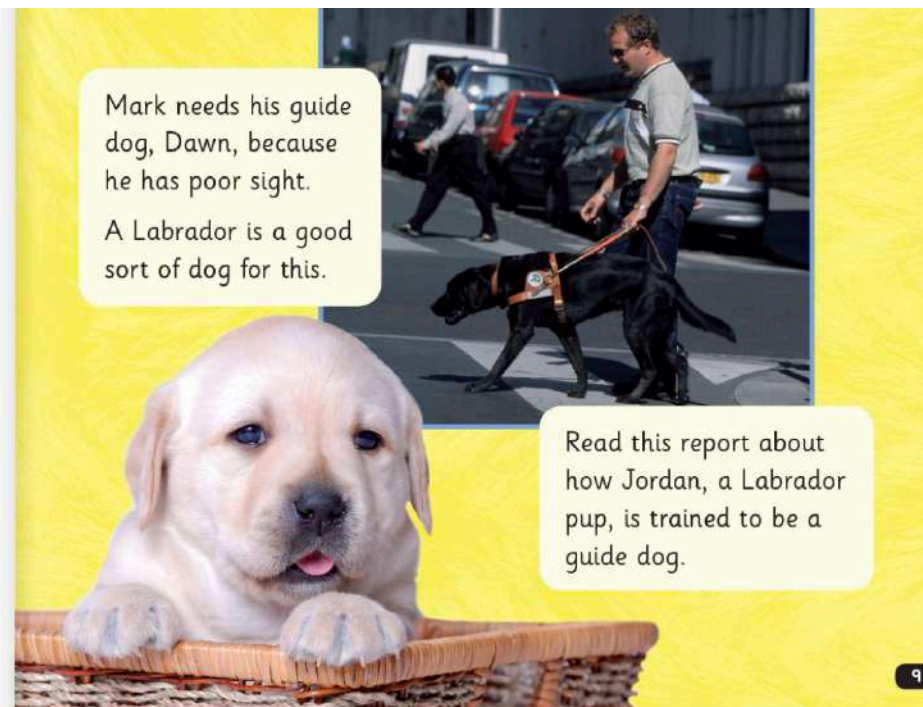
Discuss the meaning (as used in the non-fiction text) after the children have read the word.

All pups can be playful, but a guide dog pup has to behave. His owner's life will be in his hands – or his paws!

6 to 8 weeks after Jordan is born, he is taken out on a lead each morning to be trained.

A guide dog is trained to:

- sit
- lie down
- stay
- come.

When he is 1, a harness is worn by the pup.

He is trained in some more important lessons:

- how to stop before crossing a street
- how to go left or right on command
- how to stop his owner bumping into things
- how to deal with traffic.



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Next, the guide dog meets his owner.

They are shown how to act as a team.
