Show Don't Tell

This is a technique that writers use to create a clear picture in the reader's mind.

It makes the story much more interesting and allows the reader to fully understand how a character feels.



Remember the work that we have done previously on show don't tell sentences.

When we are writing a sentence about a character's emotions we don't use the word we are describing. For example if we are trying to say that someone is happy we wouldn't use the word happy- we might describe what the character's face looks like, what their body language might be like.
