





## Early Expeditions

Despite leaving the Navy, Shackleton was still determined to explore new, undiscovered places. His initial step was in 1901 when he took part in Robert Falcon's Scott's expedition to the Antarctic, which travelled on the ship 'Discovery'. Shackleton was undoubtedly frustrated with the expedition's many problems, which eventually caused him sent home ill.

In 1908 Shackleton embarked on a second expedition to the Antarctic on a ship named the 'Nimrod' to the Antarctic. His team got closer to the South Pole than any before them and discovered the Beardmore Glacier. This impressed King Edward VII so much, making him feel very proud, that he gave the explorer a knighthood, naming him Sir Ernest Shackleton
