



- You will need to have read the whole text. Look back through or watch the videos, then read the final section which begins with 'Preparing the James Caird'.
- Create a story map of the key events. You don't need to include everything, choose the most important events. Represent them using pictures and key words.

Now think about:

Look back through the text and think about how it is set out.

It is unusual because it is a non-fiction text (facts about a real person and something that really happened), but it looks like a story.

Can you spot these things?

- Pictures of the crew (including the dogs!) – not just a list of names like you would have in most non-fiction texts
- Text is in sections in different places, not just in paragraphs from top to bottom or left to right
- Pictures to match parts of the text – ship, places
- Pictures used to decorate the pages
