




| Introduction<br>A sentence or two to introduce the person and explain why they are well-known      | Thomas John Barnardo<br>Founded the British charity 'Barnardo's' to provide care for vulnerable children and young people.  |                   |
| Early life<br>Explanation of how their life began.<br>Any key information about their childhood.   | Born in Dublin, Ireland on 4 <sup>th</sup> July 1845.<br>Son of John and Abigail Barnardo.<br>Moved to London in 1866 where he planned to become a doctor.<br>Appalled by the amount of children living in terrible conditions. |                   |
| Major influences<br>What led them to their achievement?  | Stopped training to become a doctor due to his enthusiasm to help children in London.<br>Set up ragged school in 1867, which provided free education, food, clothes and homes to children.                                      |                   |
| Main achievement<br>An explanation of something they have done to help others/of great importance. | In 1870, Dr Barnardo started his charity (Dr Barnardo's Homes) to help as many poor children in London as possible.<br>Opened first orphanage.  |                   |
| The end of their life/what the future holds  | Dr Barnardo opened 96 homes.<br>He dies in 1905.<br>His charity still continues to this day.  |                   |
