- Make sure you have read all of 'Shackleton's Journey' if you haven't, go back to last week's lessons to do this.
- Today, you're going to use the text to retrieve and infer facts about Ernest Shackleton
- Remember, retrieve means you take it directly from the text, and infer is about your own opinion of what you think it means/tells you
- For example, using the introduction I can retrieve these facts
 - Born 15 February 1874
 - Had 9 siblings
 - Interested in books especially poetry.

Born on 15 February 1874, Shackleton was the second of ten children. From a young age, Shackleton complained about teachers, but he had a keen interest in books, especially poetry – years later, on expeditions, he would read to his crew to lift their spirits. Always restless, the young Ernest left school at 16 to go to sea. After working his way up the ranks, he told his friends, "I think I can do something better, I want to make a name for myself."

- Also in the introduction, I can infer that Shackleton is determined as it says "I think I can do something better, I want to make a name for myself."
