

Examples of pronouns

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Pronouns replace a noun.

Take care!

Sometimes it is not clear who or what the pronoun is referring to.

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James cooked his dad a meal and he thought it was delicious.

Who is the 'he' referring to? It could be James or his dad and this would change the meaning of the sentence.

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


Possessive pronouns

These are pronouns which show **belonging**. They also **prevent you from repeating a noun**.

Examples: mine, yours, his, hers, ours, theirs

"Whose shoes are these?" asked mum. "They are ______," replied Jennifer.




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
Despite the heavy rain, the child still went out on ______ scooter.
